Principal's Message



2022-2023 was another year of celebration for the College.

As Hong Kong emerged cautiously out of the gloom and doom of the pandemic, the gradual return to a state of normalcy in schools in Hong Kong allowed the College to have an extended 170th anniversary celebration, making it one of its kind in the history of the College.

From the Open Day in November 2022 to the Heritage Exhibition at Central Market and the Thanksgiving Service at St. John's Cathedral in April 2023, St. Paul's College celebrated not only our long history and tradition but also the energy of our students and the vibrancy of our school life. These events, together with those celebrating the 100th anniversary of our 10th Hong Kong Scout Group, helped to bring the whole St. Paul's College community joyously together after a few devastating years of COVID social distancing and mandatory mask-wearing.

We also celebrated our students' achievements in different areas. While our school badminton team secured the overall championship in the Inter-school Badminton

Competition (Division 1), our Hockey Team also made history by winning its first-ever Guv Dillon Youth Cup. In the area of STEAM, Cheung Ming Hei (5C), Liang Yuezhe (4E), Wong Ho Him (4E), and Szeto Wang Kit (4F) from our STEAM team won the championship in the "PolyU CubeSat Mission – Space Debris Removal" programme, a two-month programme organised by the Department of Aeronautical and Aviation Engineering (AAE) and the Orion Astropreneur Space Academy (OASA). Wong Kin On Christopher (4F), Fan Siu Lung (4F) and Yu Chun Chai (4E) also won the top prize in the prestigious Hong Kong Institution of Engineers Innovation Competition. As for individual achievements, So Joshua Chun Him (3B) became the first SPC student to clinch the championship title in the prestigious HKFYG Public Speaking Contest (Junior Division) while Fung Hong Ching (5F) and Wang Chris Sen Yu (3A) won the Hong Kong Island Outstanding Student Award in the Senior Division and the Junior Division respectively.

In 2022-2023, SPC went green to promote a sustainable campus.

The College joined the "Jockey Club BEAM Plus in Schools Projects" organised by Hong Kong Green Building Council and Business Environment Council. The project instilled the concept of green building, helping students and staff members to reduce our carbon footprint by installing light sensors, LED lights, tap aerators and inverter air-conditioners. The College was honoured to be one of the three pioneer schools in Hong Kong to receive the BEAM Plus Existing Schools outstanding certificates in the categories of i) Sustainable Leadership and Learning, ii) Sustainable Campus Environment, and iii) Health, Comfort & Happiness. More solar panels were also installed on the rooftop of the new classroom block in Phase I and II. These panels were fully funded by the "Solar Harvest" scheme, a Government programme promoting the development of local renewable energy. The College also joined the Feed-in Tariff (FiTT) Scheme to generate 18,000kWh of electricity a year.

2022-2023 was truly a challenging but exciting year for all of us. I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to all the staff and students for their dedication and hard work in making the 170th anniversary celebration such a wonderful and memorable experience

for everyone. I would also like to thank the alumni for their unwavering support of the College both in good times and in bad times. I look forward to meeting all of you at the Reunion Dinner, the grand finale event of the 170th anniversary celebration, that will be held at the Hong Kong Exhibition and Convention Centre on 3rd December 2023.













St. Paul's College 170th Anniversary Open Days

The much-anticipated Open Days were declared open by the Principal, Mr. Dennis Yuen on the morning of November 26th.

From November 26th to 27th 2022, the College held a two-day event to celebrate a significant milestone, bringing together teachers, students, alumni, and parents. The event attracted over 22,000 registered guests, featuring a wide range of activities, including game stalls, workshops, academic exhibitions, and talks given by our distinguished alumni, which were organised by our teachers, students, parents, and alumni.

There was an atmosphere of fun and festivity around campus with guests and visitors flocking to different classrooms, special rooms and laboratories for the academic exhibitions.

The game stalls in the lower playground were a great attraction, with kids and families queuing for fun games and chances to win prizes!

For those who were looking for something more serious, there were also talks given by our distinguished alumni, while interactive STEM activities were in store for our tech-savvy friends in the Innovation Centre and the lower playground.

The two-day event was not just an opportunity for our students to showcase their talents but also a time for the whole College community to gather and have fun together.











































"Heritage and Dedication" 170th Anniversary Heritage Exhibition

During the Easter holidays (April 8-16 2023), St. Paul's College celebrated its 170th anniversary with the 'Heritage and Dedication' Exhibition at Central Market. This marked the first-ever public exhibition of the College, showcasing its contributions to local, national, and global communities over the past 170 years.

The exhibition featured precious artefacts, over a hundred interviews with 170+ SPC members, ninety biographies of individuals associated with the College in different fields, interactive digital campus models (including a future campus made in Minecraft), and student-drawn cards that captured campus life. All of these were designed by students and graduates. Additionally, the Hong Kong Museum of Education (The Education University of Hong Kong) collaborated with the College to provide a historical overview in the form of a history tunnel.

With the assistance of technology, the College's founder and first principal, Revd Vincent Stanton, delivered a welcome speech at the opening ceremony. Distinguished guests, including the Under Secretary for Education Jeff Sze and the Most Revd Andrew Chan, Archbishop of Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui, attended the ceremony. After four years of hard work, the Heritage Project Team, consisting of students, teachers, and alumni, breathed a sigh of relief as the exhibition finally opened.

Throughout the exhibition, teachers and ninety student ambassadors introduced St. Paul's to thousands of interested visitors. Conversations ranged from exchanging pleasantries to discovery, imagination, quiet wonder, and nostalgia, ending with reluctant farewells. The professional yet subdued display of Pauline spirit was evident.

The venue was transformed into a rich social space, with thousands of former and current teachers, alumni, parents and visitors showing their support. With the relaxation of Covid-19 measures, a warm conviviality filled the venue, with smiles and laughter emerging for the first time in years. The exhibition successfully connected the College community with the broader Hong Kong public, sharing similarities and differences in our shared educational heritage.

As custodians of College's heritage, the Heritage Project Team's work is far from over. Among their upcoming plans is the preparation of a full digital preservation of the exhibition in virtual format. This contribution will undoubtedly be appreciated by the historic occasion and the College's sizeable overseas community. Presentation of Framed Rubbings to St. Paul's Church

On January 29 2023, members of the College community joined a worship service at St. Paul's Church, celebrating the feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, the patron saint of our College. They also attended a special presentation ceremony, where three framed rubbings were presented to the Church.

In attendance at the service and the ceremony were Dr. Arnold Cheng, Chairman of the St. Paul's College Council, Mr. Wilson Mok, Honorary Treasurer of the College Council, Mr. Dennis Yuen, our College Principal, and Mr. Michael Mak, Headmaster of St. Paul's Primary School.

Pupils from St. Paul's Primary School also participated in the service. As choristers, they inspired the congregation with the singing of a contemporary hymn, 'As the Deer'.

At the presentation ceremony, Mr. Yuen spoke about the history of the stone signage on the exterior wall of the Bishop's House at Glenealy, Central. It was inscribed with our school name and an early motto of the College. The Principal also took the opportunity to offer his heartfelt thanks to Dr. Karen Fong, a professional conservator, who undertook the rubbing of the stone inscriptions gratis for the College. Dr. Fong has a close relationship with us since her two sons attended our College and our Primary School, respectively.

It was a joyous historical moment when the Revd Canon Dr. Thomas Pang, Vicar of St. Paul's Church, received the gift of the three framed rubbings. Our College's deep historical ties to St. Paul's Church were celebrated at the ceremony.





Distinguished Prefect Assembly Series Sessions

1. Dr. Tsang Kay Yan Joseph

We welcomed back our alumnus Dr. Tsang Kay Yan Joseph, Co-chairman of the Hong Kong Medical Association's Advisory Committee on Communicable Disease, in the first session in the Distinguished Prefect Assembly Series on 11 November 2022. The assembly series aim to inspire students to learn more about the world through the inspirational life stories of former school prefects.

In the assembly talk, Dr. Tsang reminisced about his school days, and attributed his success to effective time management and his system of prioritising important tasks. His life motto was: "The very beginning mind itself is the most accomplished mind of true enlightenment".

Our students received a lot of valuable advice and found it useful in their pursuit of life goals.











2. Prof. Wu Che Yuen Justin

In the second session of the Distinguished Prefect Assembly Series, our alumnus Prof. Wu Che Yuen, Associate Dean (Health Systems) of the Faculty of Medicine at the Chinese University of Hong Kong, delivered a speech on his days at St Paul's College which taught him about empathy, an essential skill for his academic and professional life. In his speech, Prof. Wu stressed the importance of interacting with others at school, learning from mistakes and understanding personal strengths.



After the sharing at the assembly, Prof. Wu was interviewed by the student editors of the school yearbook Wayfarer. The former Editor-in-chief of Wayfarer (Chinese Section) talked about the brotherhood among Paulines and his motivation for studying medicine. He also offered advice to current students aspiring to pursue a career in medicine.











The 60th Issue of *Wayfarer*: Celebrating the 170th Anniversary of the College

At assembly on the morning of December 7, the Editors-in-Chief for the Chinese and English Sections were invited to present the major features of the new issue of our school magazine, *Wayfarer*.

The English Editor-in-Chief, Leung Lok Him Brian (6E), and the Chinese Editor-in-Chief, Au Ki Chun Jeffrey (6E,) both spoke about the cover design.

Brian explained that the digital art images on the covers, which feature the main facades of the College on Bonham Road and its Primary School on Victoria Road, symbolise the close bond between our primary and secondary students.

Jeffrey added that the flock of colourful birds soaring out of the blue frame on each of the covers represents the six houses of Paulines, whose creative, outside-the-box thinking is taking them to new heights. He remarked that the 60th issue of *Wayfarer* marks the end, as well as the beginning, of a sexagenary cycle by the ancient Chinese calendar.

The retrospective and forward-looking themes are clearly reflected by the feature articles found in both sections. There are, for example, reports on our Anniversary Concert and Speech Day, alongside articles on the 170th Anniversary Seminar Series Plenary Session and the Distinguished Prefects Assemblies, where prominent scholars, experts and our alumni shared their views and perspectives on local and global issues that extend beyond the present horizons.

At the end of their speeches, Brian and Jeffrey offered their thanks to the school administration, the teacher advisors and all the students who were involved in bringing the publication project to fruition.

Sustainability Doubleheader Co-hosted with Environment and Ecology Bureau

On April 29 2023 (Saturday), a 'sustainability doubleheader' took place at the College, featuring the Online Climate Action Quiz Competition Prize Presentation and the launch ceremony for the "Plastic Free" School Project.

The event was co-hosted with the Environment and Ecology Bureau (EEB) 環境及生態局 EEB and the Education Bureau (EDB) and attended by over 100 participating teachers and students.

We were delighted that Miss Janice Tse Siu-wa, JP, Permanent Secretary for Environment and Ecology (Environment), honoured us with her presence at the event.

Miss Tse delivered a captivating address at the Prize Presentation Ceremony. She expressed her hope that the event would raise awareness among students and the community about coping with climate change and practicing a low-carbon lifestyle. She also encouraged young people to join hands with the Government to undertake the meaningful task of implementing the "Hong Kong Climate Action Blueprint 2050", a landmark initiative announced by the government in 2021.

The online competition, organised by the Environment and Ecology Bureau, and the Education Bureau, garnered an overwhelming response from over 8,000 secondary school students from 172 local schools. Our College was awarded the "Best Community Engagement Award" at the ceremony.

The launch ceremony for the "Plastic Free" School Project was held after the prize presentation. It aims to encourage teachers and students to change their habits of using disposable plastics. Our College has joined this campaign and will actively encourage our students to support the good cause.

The event concluded with our Sustainable Development Student Ambassadors taking our guests and visitors on a guided tour of the campus, showcasing our carbon reduction strategies, which include rooftop solar panels, power-saving light sensors, potted plants, recycling bins and a plastic-free tuck shop.

We were grateful to Miss Tse, officials from the Environment and Ecology Bureau and the Education Bureau, as well as the visiting teachers and students, whose presence and participation were instrumental in the resounding success of the event.

School Enhancement Project

Upon completion of Phase 1 in August 2019, our students and teachers enjoy a much better daily learning environment with the enlarged classrooms and upgraded classroom facilities. A major revamp and facelift of the College places Paulines on the cutting edge of STEM learning, of extracurricular activities and creativity learning in an interactive and communicative framework.

We have commenced a second-phased redevelopment project. A new main entrance foyer and College Office with other amenities which features a practical and contemporary design gives all students, staff and guests a warm welcome to the SPC campus. An indoor swimming pool with the pool heat pump system provides students with round-the-year swimming training. A redesigned library allows us to transition to a modern mode of learning incorporating smart technology which meets the new era of education needs and global reach-out for broader knowledge. While the staff room relocation allows students to have a closer interaction and hence better learning and teaching between students and teachers.

Since the piling foundation was completed last year, we have moved on to the construction of the main structure. A new structure was built in extension of the South Wing to Bonham Road and served as the cover of the new Indoor Swimming Pool. The HVAC system is designed for the best energy efficiency. While the natural ventilation and solar panels are installed to promote energy sustainability in the campus as well as serve the green education purpose.

The construction projects on the new main entrance and indoor swimming pool will be completed at the year end of 2023. The projects are in its final stage of builder work, electrical work and mechanical installation works. The project team is dedicated to making the best use of the campus in every boy's comprehensive skills and specialist interests.



So Joshua Chun Him Crowned Champion in HKFYG Public Speaking Contest 2023

Congratulations to So Joshua Chun Him (3B) who made history to become the first SPC student to clinch the championship title in the prestigious HKFYG Public Speaking Contest (Junior Division) held on Saturday, 28 April 2023. Joshua earned a place in the Grand Final after taking part in three rounds of competitions and placing first in the Hong Kong Island Division. In the Grand Final, Joshua expressed his thoughts eloquently and responded well to questions from the judging panel. Apart from impressing the judges with his cogent speech quality, he emerged as the winner for the Audience Favourite Award.

In the same competition, Cheung Ting Yu (2B) and Wong Pak Yin (2C) were a semi-finalist and a district finalist respectively while Chow Chi Hoi (1B) and Guo Garin (1D) were awarded a certificate of good performance.

St. Paul's College STEAM Team Wins Championship in Space Debris Removal CubeSat Mission

St. Paul's College is pleased to announce that its dedicated STEAM team has attained the Championship in the challenging "PolyU CubeSat Mission – Space Debris Removal" programme. The team members celebrated for their exceptional achievement include Cheung Ming Hei from class 5C, Liang Yuezhe and Wong Ho Him from class 4E, Szeto Wang Kit from class 4F, and their coach Mr. Chan Ping Yiu, the STEM coordinator of the school.

The two-month programme was jointly organised by the Department of Aeronautical and Aviation Engineering (AAE) at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU) and Orion Astropreneur Space Academy (OASA). They aimed to encourage and inspire students in S.4 and S.5 to engage in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) through the creation of their CubeSat, a type of miniaturised satellite.

The programme's objectives were manifold. It aimed to unleash the students' innovative mindset and expose them to the critical thinking skills needed in various roles such as engineers, entrepreneurs, platform specialists, and scientists. In addition, it aimed to enhance their awareness of the diverse STEAM-related degree programmes offered at PolyU. The programme also sought to ignite students' interest in STEAM and their passion for technology, interdisciplinary learning, and the circular economy through the hands-on experience of building their CubeSat. Furthermore, it aimed to strengthen teamwork, leadership, and other essential soft skills for future development in school and the workplace. Finally, the programme exposed students to the fundamentals of design, business, technology, and the New Space economy.

Over the course of the programme, the students devoted their Saturdays to participating in ten enriching sessions, including lectures, workshops, laboratory visits, and software design activities. They were under the expert guidance and mentorship of scholars from both PolyU and OASA throughout the programme.

The mission of the competition was to challenge the teams to design a CubeSat capable of removing space debris orbiting the Earth. This task is of significant importance in the development of future space technologies.

In the final presentation held on April 29th, 2023, the team from St. Paul's College exhibited their innovative concepts and unwavering determination, earning high commendations from all the judges.

St. Paul's College extends its heartfelt congratulations to the champions for their remarkable achievement. The school also expresses gratitude to the entire school community for their support. St. Paul's College will continue to encourage its students to engage in STEAM and explore the infinite possibilities that this field holds.









St. Paul's College Students Excel in IdeaPOP! 2023 Startup Competition

St. Paul's College is pleased to announce that its joint school team, composed of members from the STEAM Team and Entrepreneurship Club, has secured the 2nd Runner-up award in the highly competitive IdeaPOP! 2023 startup competition. The team includes Lung Tin Chak from class 5C, Alson Shiu Chun Fai and Daniel Sinn Wang Chun from class 4C, and Heison Ng Chun Hei from class 3C, guided by Mr. Chan Ping Yiu, the STEM Coordinator of the school.

IdeaPOP!, a startup pitching competition for secondary school students across Hong Kong, is designed to nurture innovation and entrepreneurship and offer participants pre-incubation experience beyond the traditional classroom environment. This year, the competition was organised by the SEED Foundation and, for the first time, all participating teams participated in a series of mentorship and training workshops. These workshops helped the teams to develop and present a professional pitch deck, which they later presented to industry experts. The competition tested the students' creativity and innovation, social impact, commercial viability, and sustainability of their projects.

The team from St. Paul's College developed an innovative application named "Brain Station". This app is uniquely tailored for autistic children and their families, providing personalised, interactive learning experiences in line with the most recent research on autism. The app employs gamification, multimedia, and advanced technologies like machine learning and virtual reality to enhance the social and communication skills of children with autism. Additionally, it includes a community platform for parents to connect and share their experiences, offering invaluable support.

The students underwent mentorship and training workshops from December of the previous year until March this year. The semi-pitch was conducted on March 25th, and the final competition took place on April 1st, 2023, where ten finalist teams competed for the championship.

A highlight of the event was the mention of the St. Paul's College team in an article by Ms. Cindy Chow, the Executive Director of Alibaba Hong Kong Entrepreneurs Fund, and one of the final judges. Ms. Chow noted the team's strong empathy, reflected in their ability to analyse the feelings and needs of various stakeholders, including the target customer group.

St. Paul's College takes immense pride in seeing their students embody the school's core value of "Compassion" in their innovative work. The school extends its heartfelt gratitude to the dedicated students, the school community, and all parents, teachers, and friends for their support throughout the competition. Congratulations to the team for their commendable achievement in IdeaPOP! 2023.

St. Paul's College is proud to announce the successful participation of its students in the Young Astronaut Training Camp 2023. This programme, initiated in 2009, is organised by the Leisure and Cultural Services Department and the Chinese General Chamber of Commerce in collaboration with the Hong Kong Space Museum and the Beijing-Hong Kong Academic Exchange Centre. The camp aims to foster an interest in astronomy and space science among Hong Kong's youth and to enhance their understanding of the development and achievements of space technology in China.

The selected students, Szeto Wang Kit from class 4F and Chu Chun Heen from class 3F, were part of the school's STEAM team. Led by the school's STEM Education Coordinator, Mr Chan Ping Yiu, the two students were chosen after three rigorous selection rounds to participate in the eight-day camp.

The Young Astronaut Training Camp 2023 includes an array of activities such as dialogues with scientists and space experts, visits to astronomical and space facilities, and learning about astronomy, space science, and space technology. The students also traversed various locations related to China's astronomy and aerospace development, including the National Astronomical Observatory Xinglong Station in Chengde and the Mogao Grottoes in Dunhuang.

The three selection rounds involved a quiz on relevant topics, a three-day camp, and a group interview. From an initial quiz round where the top 80 students were selected to advance, the process culminated in a group discussion where the top 30 candidates were chosen to participate in the training camp.

The students embarked on their journey on July 29th and concluded on August 5th, 2023. Despite several challenges, including a cancelled flight and adverse weather conditions, the students made the most of their journey. They had the opportunity to participate in unique activities, observe awe-inspiring astronomical phenomena, and gain invaluable knowledge.

One of the highlights of their journey was the visit to the XingLong Station. Here, the students were exposed to the LAMOST facility and a 2.16m radius telescope, a technological marvel invented locally in China. Another memorable experience was the sight of the night sky in the northwestern part of China, where they witnessed a sky filled with stars, including a clear view of the Milky Way.

The students expressed their gratitude towards their tutors, leaders, and the school for their unwavering support throughout the selection process and the trip. Despite the demanding nature of the trip, the students acknowledged that the challenges they encountered provided them with invaluable opportunities for growth and self-enhancement.

This inspiring journey has undoubtedly broadened the students' horizons, enriched their knowledge, and instilled in them a deeper appreciation for astronomy and space science. The memories and experiences they gained will be treasured for a lifetime.

Francis CHAN Ka-Nin, SPC class '68, is a Canadian composer and professor in University of Toronto's music faculty. He studied music composition with Jean Coulthard at the University of British Columbia. Subsequent to UBC he studied under Bernhard Heiden at Indiana University where he earned both a Master and a Doctor of Music. He pursued further studies in music composition at the Darmstädter Ferienkurse.

Chan has been commissioned to write works for the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra, the CBC Radio Orchestra, the Esprit Orchestra, the Manitoba Chamber Orchestra, the National Arts Centre Orchestra, New Music Concerts, the Quebec Contemporary Music Society, and Symphony Nova Scotia among many others. He has also been awarded funds to compose works by the Canada Council, Ontario Arts Council, Ontario's Ministry of Citizenship and Immigration, and the Toronto Arts Council.

- 2001 the Dora Mayor Moore Award for Outstanding New Musical (the opera Iron Road).
- 2002 his chamber work Par-çi, par-là, won another Juno Award for Best classical composition.
- 2017 The Toronto Symphony Orchestra recorded the composer's My Most Beautiful, Wonderful, Terrific, Amazing, Fantastic, Magnificent Homeland on their CD Canada Mosaic SESQUIES.
- 2018 the Dragon's Tale was awarded the Kathleen McMorrow Award.
- 2022 his Pikä Talvi (long winter) was premiered by percussionist Antti Ohenoja and a string quartet in Helsinki. His Harp Concerto was premiered by Sinfonia Toronto with harpist Teresa Suen-Campbell later in the same year.
- 2023 his "Welcoming Spring" was premiered by Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra. He is presently writing a flute concerto for Italian virtuoso flutist Luisa Sello.

Message from Convenor of the Fundraising Committee



We are pleased to report significant progress in the School Enhancement Project in 2022. The foundation for the new structure of Phase 2 was completed in July of last year. The main construction of the New Entrance and Indoor Swimming Pool began in September 2022 and is making good progress towards the target completion date. We anticipate that it will be completed before the end of 2023 if everything goes according to schedule.

In other exciting news, the Class of 1977 raised over HK\$2 million for the School Enhancement Project in just one month, exceeding their original target. What's even more impressive is that 81 classmates participated, representing

more than 30% of their class and recording the highest participation rate so far. Their success demonstrates their love for the school and strong bonds among the group. We hope their efforts serve as a model for us to follow. Thank you to all team members, donors, and unsung heroes for their dedication.

The Alumni Endowment Fund for Scholarships has continued to make progress in 2022. 

Capital Fund (HK\$ 101,665,105.87)


In 2019, St. Paul's College began its second enhancement of the campus to meet the needs of the 21st Century education. The objective of Capital Fund is to finance the School Enhancement Project, to augment the learning environment and facilities of the school premise for our students.



Endowment Fund (HK\$ 6,848,701.50)

In parallel with campus enhancement, St. Paul's College has pledged to assist qualified students who are financially constrained. The College has a proud tradition of welcoming students from a wide spectrum of family backgrounds which creates an environment for students to experience diversity.


The Endowment Fund is set up to let St. Paul's College open its doors to students regardless of their backgrounds.



Capital Fund

The School Enhancement Project is currently in its second phase, which includes the construction of a New Main Entrance and Indoor Swimming Pool. This new facility is not only a spacious and welcoming reception area, but it also provides an additional and much-needed 1,300 square meters of floor area on our campus for multi-purpose use, such as exhibitions and student performances. The construction of the new Main Entrance and Foyer will also place a roof over the Swimming Pool, making it an indoor facility that can be used year-round. This phase is crucial for relocating staff rooms and creating more space for the two-floor library in the future, and without it, we will not be able to fully realise the benefits of the School Enhancement Project.

The budget for this phase of the project is 108 million Hong Kong dollars, and we have secured 98 million so far. However, we still need an additional 10 million to complete the construction by the end of September. The pandemic and economic downturn have made fundraising more challenging, and the fundraising team was not able to organise campaigns as planned in 2022. However, Alumni Sharing sessions gradually resumed in the second half of the year to reconnect our alumni with the school community and keep them informed about our latest developments.









In April 2023, the College held the 170th Anniversary Heritage Exhibition at Central Market for two weeks, which our fundraising team leveraged to launch a campaign for the renovation of the History Gallery at the New School Entrance as well as the Opening Ceremony for the Exhibition. The campaign raised over 1 million Hong Kong dollars, which fully covered the costs and benefited the School Enhancement Project.



In May 2023, the Class of 1977 initiated a class gift drive to raise funds for the School Enhancement Project. The class exceeded their original target and raised HK\$2 million within one month, with 81 classmates participating in the drive, representing more than 30% of the 240 students in their class. As a result, the Class of 1977 recorded the highest participation rate among all classes so far. Their fundraising efforts serve as a model for other classes to follow, and we plan to share their successful campaign with other class representatives.





Endowment Fund

In January 2022, the PR Committee arranged an interview with the Principal, Mr. Yuen Dick Yan, Dennis and an alumnus Mr. Lo Hoi Kwong, Sunny, by HKET to discuss the Alumni Endowment Fund for Scholarships. The Endowment Fund is established as a long-term investment initiative that aims to generate sustainable income to support the scholarship programme.



During the interview, they discussed various ideas to promote the Endowment Fund, such as targeted outreach to potential donors, regular progress updates, and the creation of a dedicated webpage on the Foundation's website. An essential aspect is the recruitment of suitable candidates for the programme. Additionally, the Foundation has worked to educate the SPC community about the advantages of endowment giving and its positive impact on the Foundation's work.

One of the highlights of the discussion was emphasised on alumni engagement. Seeing the Foundation's commitment to long-term sustainability has encouraged alumni to consider making a lasting impact through endowment giving. This has resulted in increased support for the Fund and a growing sense of belonging among alumni who share a future commitment to the College's mission.

General Fund

The Foundation raises funds to support various projects, including the relocation of the Primary School, the global classroom, service projects, student scholarships, and e-learning. Alumni and donors have generously contributed to the General Fund by making donations and purchasing much-needed resources for the school, which has helped enhance the learning environment for the students.



Souvenirs for 170th Anniversary

As part of our anniversary festivities, we produced a range of commemorative souvenirs that were available for purchase through our E-shop. As the 170th anniversary celebrations come to a close, any remaining stocks will be sold at special occasions, such as the Open Day and 170th Anniversary Dinner.

During the College Open Days and Primary School Exhibition Day in 2022, the Foundation generated over HK\$90,000 and HK\$40,000, respectively, by selling the souvenirs. We are grateful for the support of our alumni, parents, and friends who helped make this possible.

Other Projects

Opening Ceremony of the 170th Anniversary Heritage Exhibition

St. Paul's College organised the 170th Anniversary Heritage Exhibition from April 8th to 16th, 2023, under the theme 'Heritage & Dedication' at the 1/F Event Space of Central Market. The exhibition takes visitors on an immersive journey through the past, present, and future of SPC in nurturing and empowering Hong Kong youth.







The Foundation sponsored and organised the Opening Ceremony on the first day of the exhibition, inviting Mr. Sze Chun Fai, Jeff, JP, Under Secretary for Education, Archbishop the Most Revd Andrew Chan, and Bishop of Diocese of Hong Kong Island the Rt. Revd Matthias Der as guests of honor. Respected historian Prof. Joseph Ting Sun Pao, BBS, Prof. Cheung Yan Leung Stephen, President of the Education University of Hong Kong, Prof. Lau Chipang, Associate Vice President of Lingnan University, and many renowned alumni attended the ceremony to celebrate the special occasion and preview the multimedia exhibition.



The Capital and Endowment leveraged the Heritage Exhibition to launch a fundraising campaign for the renovation of the History Gallery at the New School Entrance and the Opening Ceremony, which raised over 1 million Hong Kong dollars. The proceeds fully covered the costs and benefited the School Enhancement Project. To express our appreciation to the sponsors, we organised an Appreciation Luncheon on the same date at the Chariot Club, inviting Prof. Joseph Ting Sun Pao, Prof. Lau Chi Pang, and Mr. Jasper Tsang Yuk Shing as guest speakers. They shared interesting stories about the history of our college, and our sponsors enjoyed the luncheon very much.

PR Support of the 170th Anniversary Heritage Exhibition

The Foundation engaged a PR consultant to execute the PR plan for the event, which included press releases before and after the event and newsletters to our constituents. The news provided a different angle and perspective on the exhibition and its exhibits, inviting our target audience to visit the exhibition. In addition, we invited our students to be interviewed for the HOY TV programme to share their experience and learning from spending nearly 3 years creating the Future St. Pauls' in Minecraft, which was exhibited in SPC's Heritage Trail during the exhibition.
