Subject: 'Northern Lights': Outdoor Education and Environmental Tour to Canada

The St. Paul's College Global Classroom programme endeavours to give students an opportunity to experience a wide range of educational, sporting, musical and recreational activities.

As part of the ongoing provision of summer educational excursions which build upon, extend and complement our College curriculum, the College offers the 'Northern Lights Tour to Canada' from 9th July to 19th July, 2010. This tour gives our students a chance to experience the wide open spaces of Canada, and take part in outdoor educational 'hands-on' experiences which are intended to complement their classroom understanding of man and his environment. The tour will include a visit to the famed 'Calgary Stampede', an annual event celebrating Canada's outdoor culture. We will also visit many natural wonders in Canada's national parks, and we hope for our students to gain many new experiences through these visits. The tour will be completed in Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories of Canada, and provide a chance (weather permitting) for our students to view the famed 'aurora borealis' or Northern Lights,

This educational tour will be supervised by Mr. Ryan (Careers Master), Miss Yu, (Guidance Mistress) and Mr. Tang (Sports Master). In addition, Miss Sophie Wong, who is responsible for the arrangements of many of the College tours, will also accompany the group. The number of available places is 30. Students who have conduct or behavioural issues will not be selected for the tour.

The trip will start on the 9th July, and return to Hong Kong on the 19th July. The total cost of the trip will be approximately HK\$13,000, depending on final costs for insurance and incidental expenses. The College Council has kindly granted the participants a significant subsidy, allowing us to keep the cost to a minimum.



DAY 03

Peace River - High Level

Traveling west to Grimshaw, we arrive at Mile 'O' of the Mackenzie Highway: an important transportation route to the North. We will cross the might Peace River by ferry before visiting visit Fort Vermillion – Alberta's oldest community. Our final destination today is High Level for the night. (B, L, D)

DAY 04

High Level - Fort Smith

After crossing the 60th parallel today, stop for a picnic lunch and then continue along the "Waterfalls Route" of the Mackenzie Highway. We will view Alexandra Falls and Louise Falls. Today's destination is historic Fort Smith. Here you will meet some of the North's most interesting personalities – all with their own tales to tell. (B, L,D)



DAY 05

Fort Smith - Wood Buffalo National Park

Today the group will travel into Wood Buffalo National Park which was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1983. You will see karst sinkholes at the Angus Fire Tower, the Salt Plains, Wood Buffalo Interpretive Centre and herds of bison. With 230 species of birds including the Whooping Crane, binoculars are a must. Our local guide will ensure you get an informative tour, as well as an authentic fish barbecue dinner. (B, L, D)

DAY 06

Fort Smith - Fort Providence

Return today to Wood Buffalo National Park, stopping at Lady Evelyn Falls and the small community of Kakisa. A short ferry ride brings you to Fort Providence where a delightful evening awaits you with a demonstration of Moose Hair Tufting and Porcupine Quill Art by a local Dene artist. (B, L, D)

DAY 07




Fort Providence - Yellowknife

Our day starts by traveling through Mackenzie Bison Sanctuary and from there, by Rae-Edzo; the largest Dene community in the Northwest Territories. On arrival in Yellowknife early this afternoon, a city tour will introduce you to the city built on dreams, perseverance and ingenuity. (B, L, D)

DAY 08

Yellowknife

Today we will visit the Legislature and the Prince of Wales Northern Heritage Centre. Prepare for evening Aurora view (till around 2 a.m.)
