## St. Paul's College Cambridge Summer School Programme



The programme will last 13 days from 8<sup>th</sup> July 2010 to 21<sup>st</sup> July 2010 and students will be taught GCE AS level topics in Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics by our own teaching staff. Morning lessons will be conducted in the lecture theatre and tutorial rooms at Trinity Hall of the University of Cambridge. It will then be followed by laboratory sessions in the afternoon in the Leys School, an independent high school situated just on the edge of the beautiful city of Cambridge. The programme is specially designed for students in Form 4 or above who are interested in learning advanced topics beyond what is covered in the HKDSE (Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education).

### Highlights of the Programme

Apart from the lectures and laboratory sessions, there are other activities organized to help students enjoy their stay in Cambridge. These activities include:

- High table dinner at both Trinity Hall and another College
- Punting on River Cam
- Visits to Fritzwilliam Museum, the Museum of Zoology and Scott Polar Research Institute
- Evensong at the King's College Chapel
- Watching a Shakespearean play
- A literature workshop on Shakespeare
- Guided tours of King's College and St. John's College
- A game of rounders
- Two full-day excursions to London visiting famous sites including the Westminster Abbey, British Museum, Buckingham Palace, Tower of London, London Eye and Thames cruise

#### Accommodation

Students will stay in shared accommodation in Trinity Hall which is one of the prettiest colleges in

Cambridge. The College, founded by Bishop Bateman of Norwich in 1350, is the fifth oldest surviving college of the University of Cambridge.

#### Cost

The estimated cost of the tour is HK\$20,000 per student (after College Council subsidy). It covers tuition and teaching materials, laboratory costs, accommodation, all meals, cost of visits, travel to and from Heathrow Airport

and airfares. It does not include, however, travel insurance and pocket money.
